Information on C-SEB BRIDGING GRANTS

To initiate new research projects and motivate scientific exchange between disciplines, C-SEB invites applications for C-SEB Bridging Grants.

Bridging Grants of up to 40,000 € are available for interdisciplinary research initiatives that focus on connecting approaches and findings from different disciplines covered by C-SEB.

Eligibility and Requirements

Bridging Grants are open to all C-SEB principal investigators employed at the University of Cologne. Projects are only eligible for application if at least two C-SEB principal investigators from different disciplines collaborate. The content of the research project must relate to C-SEB's overall topics.

Application and Selection Procedure

Decisive criteria for the granting of funds are the scientific quality and originality as well as the cost-effectiveness of the proposed research project. Across all research funding lines, each individual may submit only one application per round as lead applicant. The C-SEB Executive Board selects among the duly received proposals. The application deadline is April 30th, 2024.

Please submit the <u>application form</u> along with a research proposal and the CVs of all researchers involved in a single PDF file to <u>c-seb@uni-koeln.de</u>. Applications are limited to 2 pages for the proposal, 1 page for references, and 2 pages for each CV. Please be prepared to give a short presentation on your proposed project should we ask you to do so.
